# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The 2024-25 tenure of Social Welfare and Trust (SWAT) was a transformative year of social innovation, inclusive outreach, and grassroots empowerment. Through a combination of flagship drives, targeted Social Development (SD) cases, and collaborative events, SWAT made meaningful contributions to communities across Karachi and beyond, reaching underserved groups including the elderly, children, daily-wage workers, and women.

20 Social Development projects were executed that empowered individuals with tools and resources to build sustainable livelihoods, ranging from bikes and vending carts to sewing machines, kiosks, and micro-enterprise setups. These interventions directly advanced numerous Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly in the realms of poverty alleviation, decent work, health, education, gender equality, and climate action.

In addition to our core flagship events, including the Pinktober, Winter Drive, Ration Drive, Ramadan Drive, and Meat Drive, this year also saw several first-time initiatives such as:

- A Menstrual Hygiene Drive led entirely by SWAT girls.
- Girls participating in iftar distributions for the first time.
- Hosting two Blood Drives in one tenure.
- Expansion of drives to multiple underserved regions across Sindh.

Through strategic planning and a people-centric approach SWAT has proudly aligned its portfolio with 13 out of 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.




## **EID DAY 02 - SAHARA VILLAGE**



## SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

The Social Development Department of SWAT lies at the heart of our mission, to uplift underprivileged individuals through long-term, dignified, and sustainable means. Rather than offering short-term relief, we focus on empowering people to build their own livelihoods, restoring not just financial stability, but also self-worth and independence.

In 2024-25, we executed 20 SD cases, providing deserving individuals with income-generating assets such as bikes, stalls, sewing machines, kiosks, and tools for trade. Every project was designed after field verification, interviews, and agreements to ensure transparency, need-based support, and sustainability.

These initiatives aligned with key UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) including No Poverty, Decent Work, and Reduced Inequality, driving real change from the ground up.

March 18<sup>th</sup>, 2025



## **BEYOND NUMBERS, TOWARDS CHANGE**

As we conclude a transformative tenure, it fills us with immense pride to share that the Social Welfare and Trust Society (SWAT) positively impacted the lives of over 20,000 individuals across Karachi and interior Sindh this year. From distributing over 2,800 winter bags, 1,600 ration bags, and 10,000 meals during Ramadan in sehri and iftar, to collecting over 300 blood samples, each potentially saving three lives, our efforts were deeply rooted in care and impact. We also distributed more than 1,000 kilograms of meat during Eid-ul-Adha, donated PKR 30,000 to the Fatimid Foundation and PKR 40,000 to Afzaal Memorial Trust, and contributed PKR 100,000 to Shaukat Khanum Memorial Cancer Hospital. Our medical efforts reached over 588 individuals at our Lyari camp and provided essential healthcare to orphans at Farzana Orphanage. Alongside these efforts, we successfully organized two blood drives and executed 20 sustainable Social Development (SD) projects, enabling deserving individuals to establish consistent and dignified income streams.

These numbers are more than metrics; they represent children who smiled, elders who felt seen, and families who regained hope. Our alignment with 13 out of the 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals stands as a testament to the strategic depth, compassion, and lasting relevance of our work.

Building on this momentum, we look ahead with renewed vision. SWAT aims to further expand its reach, scale Social Development projects to support more families, deepen collaborations with grassroots organizations, and enhance operational transparency through digital systems. Our focus for the coming year includes greater youth involvement, female-led initiatives, and community-based models that foster ownership, empathy, and empowerment. With unwavering dedication, we remain committed to transforming lives, one initiative, one individual, and one act of kindness at a time.
